

## **Seller Sales Agreement**

All vehicles sold “as is,” with no warranties express or implied. Odometer statements are completed according to New York State Motor Vehicle guidelines which state, in part, “to the best of my knowledge [the person completing the odometer statement], this odometer reading reflects the actual mileage as seen on the odometer.” All purchases are subject to any continuing liens that may exist. It is not the responsibility of the seller to list liens or notify the buyer of any existing liens that may be listed on the title. Reasonable efforts are made to notify previous owners and lienholders, and to advise them of the opportunity to claim their vehicles when appropriate.

This motor vehicle is an abandoned, impounded or otherwise seized motor vehicle being offered for sale by a municipal agency in accordance with applicable statutes. Vehicles are sold without a title. In lieu of a title, the buyer and seller will execute a bill of sale, a copy which will be provided to the buyer. The Bill of Sale is not transferable and will generally enable the buyer to obtain a title in New York State. Buyers are cautioned motor vehicle departments in other states may have additional rules for titling and registering vehicles. Buys are solely responsible for ascertaining and complying with any such requirements.

Vehicles must be retrieved within ten (10) business days from the date of purchase. Failure to retrieve the vehicle and wholly remove it from the premises will result in an additional fee of thirty dollars (\$30) per business day, which must be paid before the vehicle is released. Adequate and lawful means of safely removing vehicles from the premises must be utilized—ropes and nylon straps may not be utilized to tow vehicles from the premises.

Salvage Vehicles: Vehicles with an open NYS MV907 Salvage Certificate will require a physical inspection to be conducted by DMV prior to registration and issuance of a title. A fee is charged by the NYS DMV for this inspection.

A Suffolk County Board of Ethics ruling prohibits County employees from bidding on vehicles auctioned by Suffolk County. This prohibition extends to the employee’s spouse and minor children of the employee less than 18 years of age.
